Welcome to the May edition of Thrussington Life. Over Easter we lost one of our volunteers and contributors to the magazine. My memories of Alan Jinks are fond ones, he was so energetic and I remember being amazed when I saw him celebrating his birthday this year that he was 80! Our thoughts are with Paula and their family.

Alan Michael Jinks was born 1st Feb 1933 at Strood in Kent and was the only child of parents Wilfred and Constance. They moved to the area of Humberstone Leicester in 1940, when he was 7. Alan went to Humberstone Junior School and then Wyggeston Boys Grammar School. He played Rugby and after he left played for the Oadby Wyggs. Alan had a strong connection with these all of his life. A few years ago he was president of the Wyggeston Old Boys Association and at the time of his death was vice president and life member of the Oadby Wyggs Rugby Club. His grandson Harry now plays for the club.

After school he took articles at the local firm of Bolton Bullivant and qualified as a chartered account in 1958 and eventually became a partner in the firm. Subsequently the practice merged with the international firm Price Waterhouse. Four years after that in 1973, Alan together with two colleagues set up the practice of Jinks & Co initially on the New Walk before moving to London Road. He met Paula at a Cricket match at Grace Road in 1954 and they were married in 1958. They set up home in Davenport Road, Evington before moving to Thurnby in 1977. They had two sons David in 1961 & Martin in 1963 both sons followed Alan to the Wyggeston School and also became Accountants despite vowing they never would. Martin eventually joined Alan at Jinks & Co. It is interesting to note that although Alan has been retired for some time, Martin has received numerous letters from his old clients expressing condolences. These letters show what high regard they all had for Alan. Alan along with his sons was active members of the Scouts and this was where he met many lifelong friends.

Once Alan finished his sporting activities he was drawn to Freemasonry and he threw himself at fully. They moved to Thrussington in 2001 and both Alan and Paula quickly became involved in the community and village life and were warmly accepted. It did not take long for Alan to chat with the Landlord Bob, and find out he was a Rugby fan and that he arranged trips to matches (usually for men) but Paula went along as an "honorary bloke" and enjoyed many weekends following the Leicester Tigers around Europe.

Recently at his 80th Birthday celebrations, Alan honestly stated that for both of them the past 12 years in Thrussington had been amongst the happiest of their lives. Alan knew some ten years ago that he had a weak heart but was not prepared to be wrapped up in cotton wool. He loved life and never grumbled or complained, he was always optimistic – the only down side was that he liked traditional Jazz and some of his jokes were pretty awful. All in all, Alan was the just the type of person everyone wanted to be with.


He will be sadly missed.

REMOVAL OF BOLLARDS BY HIGHWAYS

Encouraging news to report! Two (of the five) bollards will be replaced – one at either end of the footpath! A Highways Officer attended the March Parish Council meeting to apologise for Highways' lack of consultation with the Parish Council over this matter. The Council wanted reparation as well as an apology and, eventually, Highways agreed to the request. A further site meeting took place with the officer and councillors were able to agree the positioning of the new bollards, taking account of current footpath width regulations. These two bollards will be installed in about three months' time, we are told. So, it is a result of sorts, and we have to thank our County Councillor Dave Houseman for his efforts on our behalf.

We also hope that, following this incident, Highways' officers will be instructed to consult with parish councils in advance of any work within villages.

PARKING IN SYSTON TOWN SQUARE CAR PARK

Please be aware that the parking charges in the above car park, adjacent to the Co-op, have been increased one hundred percent to £1 for two hours. Oddly, the charge for four hours is £1.20!

The Parish Council has learnt that the car park is privately run, so the Town Council has no jurisdiction over the charges. However, they are as annoyed as everyone else and have complained to the owners. On the brighter side, if one uses that car park and shops at the Co-op, the store will be refund the charge. 



A quiet place

The Abbey is a retreat house: a place of sanctuary, a place where people can go to find some peace and quiet, to take stock, to find a new beginning, to be refreshed, to listen and to pray.



It's a place for anyone and everyone. Launde offers of full programme of retreats and quiet days, but also hosts a wide variety of meetings, conferences, and training courses. You can stay overnight or just spend the day there – you can even simply call in for coffee, lunch or afternoon tea.

Church Warden's Notes

AGM's are not the most exciting of events, but they do help to concentrate the mind on things achieved and things to come, both spiritual and practical. The Vestry Meeting re-elected Sue Bradshaw and myself as churchwardens and other PCC members were re-elected for another 12 month period.

Thanks were expressed to all those who, often unseen, or taken for granted gave their time to keeping our church clean and beautiful, arranging and helping at all the services – the sidesmen, choir members and organists, cleaners and flower arrangers, bell ringers.

Practically the accounts showed that the year (31^{st} Dec) ended up showing a sufficient surplus to carry us into the new year. 2012 was a busy year – the new Toilet and Servery facilities were completed, a big enhancement to our church but at a total cost of £25,000 (less Grants received of £9,500) which depleted the hard earned Restoration Fund after many years fund Raising!

The Annual costs amounted to £13,000; including Insurance - £1,400, Heating and lighting - £1,635; Mowing churchyard extension - £765 (after grant of £150 from the Parish Council); Sundry repairs (heaters, roof tiles, organ) - £1,200 and the Parish Share - that is our contribution to the cost of our clergy - £7400. So you can see why we need to keep our Income up!.
